55. HIPHIL

From the Qal גָּדַל 'he was great' is derived the Hiphil (Causative) הִגְדִּיל<sup>d</sup> 'he caused to be great', 'he magnified'; from the Qal מָלַךְ 'he reigned' is derived the Hiphil הִמְלִיךְ 'he caused to reign', 'he made king'.

<sup>c</sup> Pual part. m. pl., since the part. is a verbal adj.
